

ISA PROJECT-GRADE V

TEXTILE PRINTING

- The British Council-ISA Project on "Lasting Impressions – Reviving the art of dyeing in India, Sri Lanka and Indonesia" for the students of Grade V and VI commenced where different types of textile print fabrics like " Batik", "Block Prints", "Leheriya" and Bandhani" were shown to the students. A PowerPoint presentation on information about the various textile printing techniques and videos regarding the steps involved in the process of printing, origin and inspirations of the prints of India, Sri Lanka and Indonesia were also shown to them.



- To give the students of grade V and VI an insight into the ancient art block printing and 'tie and dye' printing, a special workshop was conducted by Ms. Ratna from Pidilite Company in the school on 26th and 27th April. The students were inquisitive and enthusiastic about carrying out the activity where the students of grade V made beautiful and interesting patterns on dupattas, table napkins and coasters using block prints. The students of Grade VI carried made beautiful colorful dupattas using tie and dye printing.



- A parent involvement program on textile printing was organised on 1st August in school premises where parents enthusiastically participated in the program which included showing a power point presentation on types of textile printing techniques, showing different uses of printing other than textiles like making cards, invites using block printing, and how vegetables like potato, lady finger etc. can be used to make patterns.

They also took part in the exhibition put up showcasing student's work on textile printing.
